- Energy audit in 2006 led to major reductions in energy and water usage - Energy Star Award - 2014, Energy and Water Award for Downtown - 2018
- The Mustard Seed Garden provides organic vegetables for Clyde's Kitchen and now has a pollinator garden.

INITIATIVES

- Reduce pesticides & introduce more native plants to host the insects, including bees and butterflies, and attract birds and other wildlife.
- Install solar roof panels to power our congregation with God's radiant bounty
