Letter from the Rector

Dear Friends,

Everything is waiting for you.

David Whyte's poem has been on my desk this summer, as we have been planning and preparing for the upcoming program year. It puts a smile on my face every time I see it and makes me wonder if my water bottle is pleading with me to try a taste and the bottle of holy oil praying for our baptism candidates and maybe the old desktop phone is grieving its loss of place in the world. God's creation and the work of our hands is animated and inviting us to life even more abundant, and we are here for it.

The wonderful stewardship committee led by Mignon Crawford has invited us to be both bold and intimate. We are working to build and strengthen relationships and connections across our parish—both new and old. We are re-establishing the ties that bind us, supporting belonging and courage in our community and in a world that would have us isolated and fearful.

We are combining that closeness to a bold goal that speaks to our future. We will be working on raising our stewardship pledges by 10% each year, for the next three years. That will get us to \$3 million a year in pledge income, before endowment draw and other income. That is what it would take for us to stop doing small capital campaigns every few years. It is what we need to expand service and justice ministries, grow our Children, Youth, and Families ministries and formation and discernment programming. It is what we need to have a healthy reserve to care for our magnificent campus, and to develop the vitality that reflects our call to love and serve our neighbors. We are not asking you to stretch beyond your healthy capacity. We are inviting those who do not pledge, to consider it seriously. For those of you for whom a modest gift to the church has been your practice, we are inviting you to make St. Luke's a central part of your giving. For those of you who are new, join us. Your commitment enables us to plan for and build our ministries together. We are ambitious to reflect God's love for this broken world from Peachtree Street.

I could not be more excited about what will be revealed among us through your spirit-led insights. St. Luke's is a warm, thriving community with a future beyond any of our capacity to imagine. How exciting to continue stepping into that future together.

I ask that you prayerfully consider how you can help St. Luke's reach its 2024 pledge goal of \$2.5 million, so we may continue to imagine and grow our work together.

The next time you are at church, I invite you to pray about what you are called to in this time. I hope you will ask for a glimpse of what is coming and your part in it. Then, I hope you will hear God say, "Everything Is Waiting For You."






Belong







Yearn

Making A Meaningful Pledge to Fund St. Luke's and Its Ministries

WHAT IS A PLEDGE?

Your commitment to make a financial gift that supports the mission and ministries of St. Luke's. Pledging enables the church to responsibly plan and prepare for the year ahead.

HOW MUCH SHOULD | PLEDGE?

The traditional measure of giving to the church is the tithe. Tithing is the biblical principle whereby a person or family gives 10% of what they earn back to God through the church.

We encourage you to consider tithing, or working toward a tithe. The average 2023 pledge is \$4,560.

If a tithe or the average pledge sounds daunting to begin with, consider proportional giving. Start with your expected income for the next year and determine a percentage that feels right for you both spiritually and practically. From ancient times, people have given the first fruits of their labor, the first and best portion to God.

A good start for proportional giving may be 2.5% of your income, which is equivalent to pledging the first hour's pay of a 40-hour workweek.

WHEN DOES MY PLEDGE BEGIN AND END?

This campaign is raising pledges for the 2024 fiscal year; it begins on Jan. 1, 2024, and ends on Dec. 31, 2024.

CAN I AUTOMATE MY GIVING?

Yes. St. Luke's offers several ways to make your giving automatically. You may set up the payments from your card or account to occur on a weekly, biweekly, monthly, or quarterly basis. Contact the church office to learn more, 404–873–7600.

ARE THERE ALTERNATIVE MEANS FOR GIVING?

Yes. You can transfer appreciated stocks to St. Luke's and receive a deduction for the full value without incurring capital gains tax. Some parishioners also find it useful to fulfill their pledge through their IRA Required Minimum Distribution. Please contact the church office to learn more.

I AM FACED WITH FINANCIAL UNCERTAINTY, WHAT SHOULD I DO?



Your Financial Support at Work


This chart shows the projected breakdown of St. Luke's 2024 budget, which is largely funded by your support of this stewardship campaign.
